




Kal Mansur "Habitat" (2018) 48" x 48" acrylic sculptures 1735 York Ave, New York City






Kal Mansur "Wayfarer" (2022) 113" x 99" double-sided acrylic sculpture Le Meridien, Fifth Ave, New York City














Kal Mansur WeWork (2023) Acrylic sculpture, 40" x 80" x 2.75" WeWork lobby at 357 Bay Street, Toronto


















Kal Mansur "The Official Logo for Art" (2019) 96" diameter acrylic sculpture 3 Lower Jarvis St, Toronto










Kal Mansur "The Official Logo for Art" (2019) 36" diameter acrylic sculpture 3 Lower Jarvis St, Toronto






Kal Mansur "Gold Notch" (2021) 55" x 38" acrylic sculpture Columbus, Ohio




Kal Mansur "Seedling" (2018) 36" diameter acrylic sculpture Virtuous Pie, Toronto







New York City















Kal Mansur "CODA" (2017) 100 acrylic sculptures spanning 150 linear feet English as an Additional Language Institute, Toronto




Kal Mansur "Family Tree" (2017) Double-sided acrylic sculpture, 84" x 96" x 5" New York



Myta Sayo Gallery champions artists focusing on abstract painting and sculpture. Founded by Maita Sayo in 2021, the gallery is dedicated to being an approachable place to start collecting high-caliber art. Located on a major street in the west end of Toronto, the storefront gallery is a five minute drive from the Museum of Contemporary Art and a ten minute drive from the Art Gallery of Ontario.

## About the director:

Maita Sayo is an art dealer with extensive experience placing works with collectors in North America. She has facilitated the production of large-format works for corporate and hospitality spaces in Toronto and New York. She founded reference: contemporary, an online art gallery, and exhibited in nine international art fairs in New York and three in Miami from 2015-2021. She opened Myta Sayo Gallery in 2021 and hosts regular exhibitions of works by Canadian and American artists. Through her work she has cultivated strong partnerships with art consultants, architects, and designers. Maita has a master's degree in politics and pursues projects that dovetail research and fine art.
